

The Polgar and Denker tournaments

In Phoenix last week two wonderful scholastic events took place, the Polgar and the Denker tournaments. For those new to scholastic chess, both these tournaments are essentially playoffs for the national high school champions from among the high school State Champions. Both tournaments are USCF tournaments and have six rounds. The Polgar is sponsored by the Susan Polgarfoundation and the Denker is named after the late GM Arnold Denker who sponsored it through many years.

There was a three way tie (each with 5 points) for the winners of the Polgar Championship from 48 entrants: WGM Anja Corke, (2323) from California, WFM Alisa Melekhina (2057) from Pennsylvania and Abby Marshall (1891) from Ohio. All three received scholarships from the University of Texas at Dallas. A total of \$155,000 in cash prizes and scholarships were awarded the 48 girls.

There was also a three way tie (each with 5 points) for the winner of the Denker Championship from a field of 45 entrants: Josh Bakker (2132) from Massachusetts, Zhi-Ya Hu (2130) from Maryland and the winner on tie breaks, Trevor Jackson (2104) from Louisiana. Trevor received a four year scholarship from the University of Texas at Dallas.

Our own representatives from Northern California had impressive performances. Nicolas Yap, (2248) came 4th in the Denker, (and incidentally held second place winner Hu to a draw) with a score of 4.5. In the Polgar Louiza Livschitz (1816) tied for 4th with a score of 4.5 and Elisha Garg (1819) came 10th with a score of 4. When we look at the strength of the opposition, we really appreciate how well our representatives scored. Our congratulations to all three. Northern California is proud of you all.

Next year the tournament will take place in Chicago, Illinois, August 6 through 11. CalChess gives a stipend of \$300 to our representatives for both tournaments to help defray the travel costs. The representative for the Denker will be the winner of the State Championship (boy or girl). For the Polgar, which will be in its third year, the winner of the Sojourner Truth, the State Championship for Girls, will be the representative.
